COVID-19 Return-to-play documentation

It is of utmost importance that each bowling establishment takes a progressive stance in sanitizing and disinfecting to ensure the safety of their staff, guests, and customers. Social distancing precautions should also be considered to enhance further safety.

Spectators are allowed, but at the discretion of each local bowling establishment, abiding by the guidelines of the governor's restrictions for the stage(s) under at the time of play.

If spectators are allowed, family units may sit together, but must use 6 feet of social distancing from other family units, and bleachers may be at no more than 50 percent capacity with a maximum of 250 people*.

Events larger than 250 people*, should have the approval of the local health department.

Conference Coordinators and bowling center management are to work together regarding capacity limitations.

Concessions are allowed at the discretion of the local bowling establishment, pre-packaged items are recommended, but not required.

The elimination of pregame and postgame handshakes is recommended, and masks are mandated for anyone not engaged in physical activity. Neck gaiters are allowed as an easy alternative to masks.
